Murweh Shire Council Monthly Financial Report Meeting 11<sup>th</sup> April 2019

Councillors

Highlights of this month's Financial Report include:

#### Revenue

Total revenue of \$16.536M to 31 March 2019 represents 56% of the total budget of \$29.5M.

These statements are for 9 months of the financial year and generally would represent 75% of the overall budget.

There are some TMR and Flood claims which are due for payment. In addition to this Council is still waiting for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarterly payment of the Financial Assistance Grants.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Rate Levy for 2018/2019 is now overdue. There is proximately \$1.4M in arrears.

#### Expenses

Total expenditure of \$16.035M to 31 March 2019 represents 80% of the total budgeted expenditure of \$20.1M.

Some expenses are slightly over budget and these are being monitored by Management. Further some expenses should be realised as capital.

#### Outcome

There is currently a cash surplus of \$0.501M.

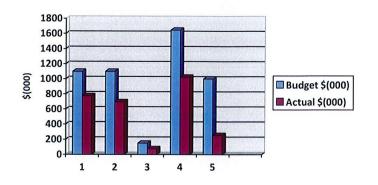

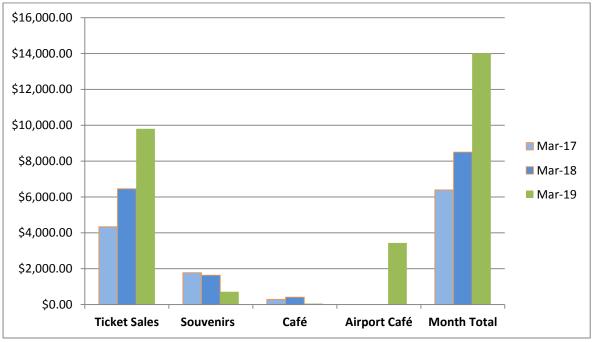


Figure 1: Ticket Sales

## Tickets:

Up until this year the Cosmos Centre has never looked at statistical data in the way we are now, so it is a little tricky to identify and examine any trends from one year to the next, in particular current monthly ticket sales vs future ticket sales. We have only just started to breakdown these numbers to give a clear picture or what is happening for future years but going off what statistics is available to me we can clearly see the marketing campaign combined with the ease of an online booking system such as Bookeasy, is working. Examining the number of people that have physically been on the tours this month compared to last year, it has dropped considerably. 2018 had 247 people attend our tours while this year is has only been 141. This drop in physical numbers is answered by looking at the cloud percentage data vs participation levels throughout the month of March 2018 & 2019. In 2018 we had cloud cover in March but it was cloudy for the first week only, reducing the numbers in this week to less than 20 for people going on our tours. This year for the first week of March we had nearly 30 people which the increase would be expected. For the last week of March in 2018 it was clear and as it was leading into April, the start of the season, we had 173 people attend our tours. This year due to this amazingly beautiful rain we have only been able to host 20 people for the last week of March. *These statistics alone show the detrimental impact clouds have on revenue and it also highlights how important the planetarium is for the Centre and how I design the new tours so that they never have to be cancelled ever again, no matter the weather.* 

Even though the weather has impacted the physical number of participants, therefore decreasing the sales in tours this month compared to years previous; I am pleased to report that ticket sales overall for March are even stronger than what they have been in many years. This strength is explained by the amount of people now buying tickets for future shows online and with us or the VIC over the phone. Social

When talking to guests about their future bookings they have all stated about social media, the Cosmos and Experience Charleville Websites and booking online, which means the current combination or our social media marketing campaign and the ease of the Bookeasy online booking system is having an impact.

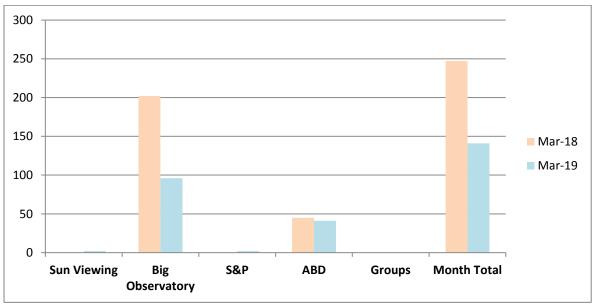


Figure 1: Number of people attending tours

## Souvenirs:

During this month of March we have been slowly working towards bringing in new and excited souvenirs that are more in-line with a science centre. Even though the number is lower than the last two years, for the length of time the stock has been on display, and how much of it has been sold already, I am forecasting a stronger busy season in souvenir sales.

#### Cafes:

The airport café is currently up and going which means my food and beverage staff have been over there and not back at the Centre with the Café here. This combined with the new kitchen supplies still having to arrive have meant the Cosmos Centre Café has been closed and will continue to be closed until such time that the airport café is adequately staffed and the kitchen at the Centre is ready to open. We are expecting more supplies for the kitchen to arrive in the next week.

The airport café has started and Katrina in particular has been working extremely hard to make it a financial success. Staffing continues to be an area of concern though with Katrina working nearly every day. We are currently training new staff though and will endeavour to make sure that it continues to be manned by the correct staff that can continue to grow it even more into the future.

## **Operational Information**

## Centre:

All painting has been completed and the Centre is getting back to normal. There is still some posters, artwork and lighting to be sorted but everything should fall into place before Easter.

The grounds are on the list for what needs to happen next. The fence, outdoor dining and cement paths should be done within the next couple of weeks.

#### Tours:

The staff continues to train and develop the new tours but for now the launch date of the new tours will have to be postponed due to staffing issues. Instead of launching come the 1<sup>st</sup> of April we hope to deliver all new tours by Easter.

#### Staff Training:

Training and logistics for the new staff and refresher for old staff is in progress.

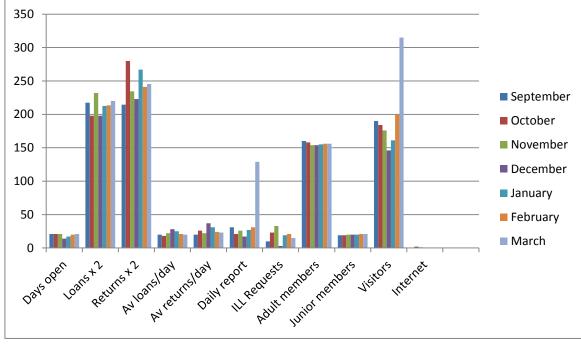

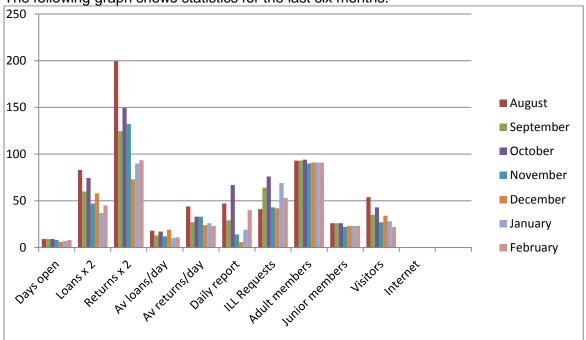

#### **Stock Route Maintenance**

Cunalama 310- Bore has been pulled, top plunger bucket was found to be broken. A submersible pump and generator has been installed to recover the turkeys nest which is now full, and will be hooked back up to the mill by 10<sup>th</sup> April. Work has also been

undertaken on the mast tower to help free up the head in lower winds, wheel weights were altered.

Glengarry 664- The siphon pump has been dismantled and to allow full removal of concrete thrust block/base. A new base will be poured and siphon pump set in place level, allowing a much more efficient operation.

Biddenham 2227- repairs undertaken to 4"trough delivery line connecting to tanks. Repairs are only temporary and require further attention when site becomes accessable.

#### Stock Route Management

New tanks at Brunel and Westyln expected to be installed by 12<sup>th</sup> April. Currently negotiating crane hire share arrangements to remove windmill heads from Yo Yo and Charleville water facilities.

#### **Noxious Weeds**

Cooladdi/Langlo Rd was inspected or Hudson Pear, some areas were treated where a high risk of spread was likely from current roadworks. Turnarounds and gravel pits were also inspected. 2 wash-down areas were established at strategic locations for all machinery exiting the area.

Bio control was set upon a small outbreak of Coral Cactus at the end of Cobb st Charleville towards the cattle pound yards.

Tiger Pear and Coral Cactus has been treated near the towers in the Pony Club paddock Charleville, more cactus has been harvested for bio breeding.

Tiger Pear and Mother of Millions has been treated at the Ward River waterhole, Quilpie rd.

Inspection of bio control on Tiger Pear at Ward plain revealed all plants dead, no living plants found in the immediate area. South of here in the 9-mile reserve requires a little help spreading around.

A small outbreak of Mother of Millions has been treated on the Cunnamulla rd. No Mother of Millions has been detected on the most recent inspection behind the vet surgery Charleville, although it is too early to claim total eradication.

#### **Routes/ Reserves**

Stock routes will be monitored closely and pasture assessments will be conducted on sensitive areas particularly Morven to Angellala Ck Landsborough highway. Most areas have received great rain, although this particular land type is proving slow to respond given the condition it was in before the rain.

#### **Travelling Stock**

One permit has been issued to Fred Ahern to walk 250 head from Augathella to 'Murweh' station via Charleville/Warrego river stock route. Travel will commence 6<sup>th</sup> April.

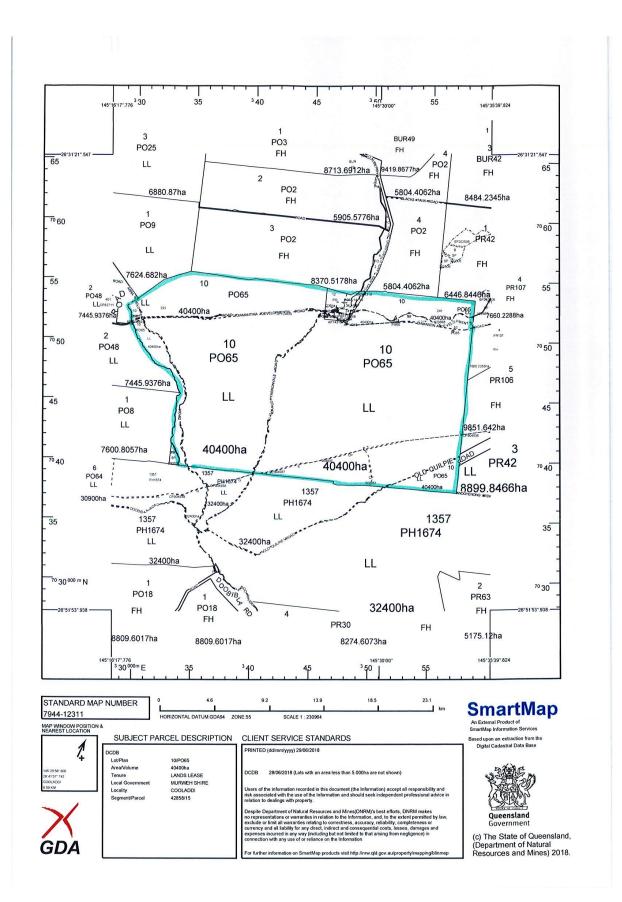

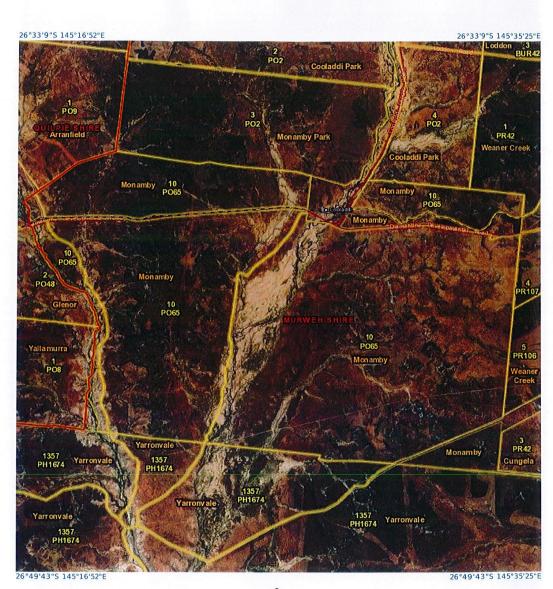
